5. What Is a Ground Cover?

A Ground Cover Is a Shrub That Spreads Out More Than It Goes Height Wise.

Ex. 1FT HIGH - 8FT WIDE

6. What Does "Bare Root" Mean?

The Word "Bare Root" Means to Have the Roots of a Tree or Shrub Showing Without Any Type of Coverage. (No B&B, No Rope or Cage, etc.)

7. What Are the Functions of a Stem?

To Transport Water and Minerals and Sugar to The Leaves and Roots.

8. What Is the Primary Function of The Leaf?

The Primary Function of a Leaf Is Photosynthesis and Transpiration.

9. What Are the Functions of The Root?

The Functions of a Root Is to Gather Nutrients, Absorb Water and Food.

10. What Are Two Common Root Systems?

The Two Main Systems Are Taproot and Fibrous.

11. What Is a Deciduous?

A Deciduous Plant Is a Plant That Loses Its Leaves During the Colder Season.

12. What Is Semi-Deciduous or Semi-Evergreen?

They Are Both a Botanical Term Which Refers to Plants That Lose Their Foliage for A Very Short Period, When Old Leaves Fall Off and New Foliage Growth Is Starting.

13. What Are Annuals?

Plants That Perform Their Entire Life Cycle from Seed to Flower to Seed Within a Single Growing Season. All Roots, Stems and Leaves of The Plant Die Annually.

14. What Are Perennials?

Plants That Live for many Growing Seasons. Generally, The Top Portion of The Plant Dies Back Each Winter and Regrows the Following Spring from The Same Root System. Many Perennial Plants Do Keep Their Leaves Year-Round and Offer Attractive Borders and Groundcovers.

15. What Is a Biennial?

Plants which require two years to complete their life cycle. First Season Growth Results in A Small Rosette of Leaves Near the Soil Surface. During The Second Season's Growth Stem Elongation, Flowering and Seed Formation Occur Followed by The Entire Plant's Death.

16. What Does Evergreen Mean?

An evergreen is a plant that has its foliage all year round EVEN in the winter as most plants lose their foliage. Evergreens are great accent plants and are nice to spice up the landscape.
